Mimi Abramovitz is the Bertha Capen Reynolds Professor of Social Silberman School of Social Work at Hunter College and The CUNY Graduate Center. She received her MSW and DSW from Columbia University School of Social Work. Her research interests include women, poverty, social welfare policy, human services and activism, Widely published and regularly interviewed by the print and broadcast media she is the *Author of Regulating the Lives: Social Welfare Policy From Colonial Time to the Present* (Routledge, 3rd. ed, 2018). Dr. Abramovitz is also investigating the impact of public policies on the human service workforce, and writing a book entitled *Gender Obligations: The History of Low-Income Women's Activism Since 1900*. She has been honored with 15 awards, most recently CSWE's Significant Lifetime Achievement Award. Often introduced as an activist and a scholar, she currently co-leads the National Social Work Voter Mobilization Campaign.
