CSSW is seeking applicants with teaching experience, scholarship and research agendas in all areas of social work, including but not limited to clinical practice, aging, implementation and translational science, management, leadership, and social entrepreneurship, and global practice.

All candidates must have a Ph.D. in Social Work or other related fields.

To hold the rank of Professor, candidates are expected to be widely recognized for their distinction.

To hold the Associate Professor rank, candidates are expected to have a demonstrated record of scholarly and teaching achievement and show great promise of attaining distinction in their field of specialization. To be considered an Associate Professor with tenure, the candidate must show an established record of innovative and vigorous funding and research productivity, and is expected to maintain an extramurally-funded research agenda while participating in the education of graduate students.

Candidates for the rank of Assistant Professor are expected to be at the beginning of a career of independent scholarly research and teaching, and demonstrate great promise of attaining distinction in their field of specialization.

Exceptional candidates for faculty positions at the rank of Professor may be considered for appointments in the following named professorships:

- Rehr/Fizdale Professorship for exceptional leadership and research contributions in Mental Health and Aging
- Ottman, R.H. Professorship for exceptional leadership and research contributions in Family and Child Welfare

Appointments may begin on July 1, 2018, or January 1, 2019. Review of applicants will begin immediately.

Applicants should upload a CV, cover letter, research abstract, list of references, and two published or in-press writing samples at the site noted below.
